Discovering Rainbows

Welcome to Discovering Rainbows. It is our aim to help families understand what is meant by the autistic spectrum. This applies to families who are awaiting a possible diagnosis or have just received a diagnosis. It is our experience that many families perceive that their family is very different to others and that no one understands their child, their battles and the challenges involved. At times it can all be very overwhelming. We hope that this six-week programme will give you more understanding, offer support and networking opportunities, in order to see there is light at the end of the tunnel. We hope that you will be able to see that as well as difficult times, there are good times to be had. In short, we hope you will discover rainbows!

The six sessions will cover the areas:-

Week 1	Introductions, safeguarding, questionnaires. The history of autistic spectrum. What is meant by social interaction difficulty? How you child presents.	
Week 2	Social Communication.	
Week 3	Rigid Thinking/Social Imagination (obsessions, rituals and routines).	
Week 4	Sensory Processing Difficulties.	
Week 5	Anxiety (managing fight, sight or freeze).	
Week 6	To be decided by families (sleep, siblings, toileting etc.)	

The sessions will be 2 hours per session. Sessions will be held at our Pinhoe centre in Exeter Dates for the sessions are:-

17th February 2024, 2nd March 2024, 20th April 2024, 18th May 2024, 29th June 2024, 20th July 2024

All session times will be 9.15-11.15am - Spaces are limited to just 8 people The cost is £120 which equates to just £10 per hour. Sessions are payable in advance £120 and non refundable. **The closing date for this course is 10th February 2024!**

Teenage Life Skills Group

We currently have spaces in our Teenage Life Skills Group! This group is open to 11-17 year olds and runs on alternate Wednesday (6 pm to 8 pm) at our centre in Pinhoe. The group costs usually costs £20 per session, payable monthly. **We are currently promoting the group with 50% discount off current prices - £10.00 per session!** If you would like to register your teenager or would like more information, please email us at infoswautism@gmail.com.
